Upon receiving the contract for the Families First Edmonton initiative and through restructuring, my role changed to assume responsibilities for Family Programs, including the Families First initiative. This initiative was a 3 year research project with a budget of \$10 million. It was a multi-sectoral initiative involving 4 Universities and 12 government and community partners. The service interventions under my management had a \$6 million budget, 24 staff, and involved 3 additional service delivery partner agencies. The interventions had a particular focus on assisting low-income families to better link to a range of existing services, testing 3 service delivery strategies, within a Randomized Control Trial research framework. Serving Immigrant/Refugee as well as Aboriginal families was of particular interest to the research with specific service strategies and in coordination with immigrant/refugee and aboriginal serving agency partners.

Manager – Housing & Family Support Programs (April/08 to August/09)

In this role, I continued to manage the Family Ties Program and acquired responsibility for Housing Services, including a 124 unit Transitional Housing facility. During this year we were successful in obtaining a \$25 million capital grant to develop the Y-Welcome Village, and had a pending grant submission of \$ 1million to expand and amalgamate our family and housing services. The position had focused on rectifying previous management practices and decisions, human resource and policy development, and operational/program systems. As Manager, I also had extensive contact with clients, crisis management, supportive counseling, addictions and mental health counseling.

Inner City Youth Housing Project -- Provides safe-house and long-term residential and support services to street involved youth.

Inner City Tuberculosis Project -- Large scale TB testing, monitoring and prophylactic outreach services for inner city residents. This project is a large mobilization of efforts in response to some active cases of TB and urgent trends of increased TB infection rates and conversions amongst residents and agency workers in Canadian inner cities.

Fetal Alcohol/Effects Intervention Project (Healthy Families – Healthy Communities Program) -- Bissell Centre in collaboration with Success By Six, Capital Health Authority, Provincial FAS Coordinating Committee, Family and Community Support Services, and Health Canada, became one of three secondary intervention pilot project sites in Alberta. This project has received 5 sources of funding from 3 levels of government.

Inner City Mental Health Program – Collaboration between Alberta Mental Health, Canadian Mental Health Association, Boyle Street Co-op, and the Bissell Centre. Is a program to support individuals with severe and persistent mental health problems maintain stability within the community, and reduce recidivism to hospital and conflict with the legal system.

Families Matter Partnership Initiative – The largest research study of its kind in Canada exploring the benefits of improving service integration models for low-income families. Manage the service delivery component of the Families First Project, a collaboration of 12 government and funding partners, 4 service organizations, and 4 universities.

MATHS – Men's Alternative Transitional Housing Services. This is a collaboration between the YMCA, Edmonton John Howard Society, Changing Ways, Native Consulting Services and the Edmonton Police Services. It is a diversion program to house male offenders of domestic violence, rather than displacing other family members.

PAAFE – Prostitution Action Awareness Foundation, Alberta Employment and Immigration, DECSA, and the YMCA work collaboratively to house women involved in prostitution wishing to leave the streets.

George Spady Society – Worked collaboratively with YMCA Housing to provide housing bridging services for individuals leaving detoxification services and waiting for substance abuse treatment services.

Housing First Edmonton – Participated in collaborative initiatives as part of the development of Housing First initiatives under the umbrella of Homeword Trust.

Regional Mental Health – Work collaboratively with YMCA Housing to provide transitional housing for those leaving hospital and part of their outreach program.

In-School Settlement Support Program – A CIC funded in-school settlement practitioner initiatives in partnership with Mennonite Centre for Newcomers, Catholic Social Services, Edmonton Immigrant Settlement Association, Edmonton Public School Board and Edmonton Catholic Schools.
